IMPORTANT

Notice to the Defendant

This Order directs you to do the acts set out in this Order. You have the right to ask the Court to vary or discharge this Order. If you disobey this Order you may be found guilty of contempt of court and you may be sent to prison or fined or have your assets seized.

The Order

An *ex parte* application was made on the 22nd day of SEPTEMBER 2009 by Counsel for the Plaintiff to the Judge and it was only attended by Counsel for the Plaintiff. The Judge heard the Application and read the Affidavit listed in Schedule 1 to this Order and accepted the undertakings in Schedule 2 at the end of this Order.

IT IS ORDERED as follows:



The Injunction

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Defendant be restrained by THEMSELVES, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES or ITS agents, and others whatsoever from confirming Bishop-elect Kaulanda until the objections raised by the Plaintiffs herein are sufficiently disposed of in open court. The Order is to subsist for 14 days pending an inter-parte application for the injunction.

Costs of the Application

The costs of this Application are awarded to the Plaintiff

Variation or Discharge of this Order

The Defendant may apply to Court at any time to vary or discharge this Order but if he wishes to do so must inform the Plaintiffs' Legal Practitioners in writing at lease 48 hours before hand.

Interpretation of this Order

In this Order, the words 'he' or 'his" include 'she' or 'he' and 'it' or 'they' or 'them'.

The Effects of this Order

A Defendant who is an individual who is ordered to do something must do it himself or in any other way. He must do it through others acting on his behalf or on his instructions or with his encouragement.

A Defendant which is a Corporation and which is ordered to do or not to do something must do it or not do it by itself or by its directors, Officers, Employees or Agents or in any other way.
